Born: 15 September 1890

Arthur enlisted in the Royal Naval Reserve (Newfoundland) at the port of St. John's in August 1914. He enlisted for the duration of the war and went on to serve almost five (5) years in the Royal Navy.

Here are the hand-written entries as found in his official service record. The entries provide a timeline and ship and/or naval facility where he was posted at the time.

 Calypso (Training vessel stationed in St. John's Harbour)
- **2.** 06 Nov 1914 25 Nov 1916: **HMS Virginian**

- **5.** 15 Jun 1917 29 Nov 1917: **HMS** Caesar

6. 30 Nov 1917 – 05 May 1918: **HMS Pembroke**

- 7. 06 May 1918 20 Jan 1919: **HMS President 111**
- 8. 21 Jan 1919 11 Mar 1919: **HMS** Vivid 111
- 9. 12 Mar 1919 01 May 1919: **HMS Briton**
- 10. 01 May 1919: Shore demobilized and discharged.

Once out of service and back home, Arthur appears in the 1921 Newfoundland general census. He is living in Coley's Point and married to a lady by the name of Rose from Bareneed. (Rosie or Rosalie. The name changes slightly with each census entry). The correct spelling is Rosely.

The 1935 census gives a picture of a family of five. Arthur, Rosie and three (3) children; Herbert, Alvera and Clayton. They are living in Coley's Point.

By the next census taking in 1945, all is virtually the same, except Alvera is no longer at home and Rosie is now termed Rosalie.

On September 21, 1953, Arthur passed away at the 63. He is buried in Grace United Church Cemetery at Coley's Point.
