According to the handwritten 1921 Newfoundland general census entries, The Sparkes family was living in Shearstown. Herbert and Caroline are both 41 and their children are: Clara 21, Pearl 18, Nora 13, Reuben 8 and Chesley age 5.

This record also shows Herbert working as a butcher. Daughter Clara is teaching school.

By the next census in 1935, both Herbert and Caroline are now 51. Herbert is farming. Chesley is 19 and working as a labourer on the farm.

Available military records show Chesley was not part of the first draft of RAF ground staff on June 14, 1940, but it appears that service numbers beginning at 339801 and going forward indicate them to be a member of ground staff.

Here's a newspaper clipping from the Local Paper "The Guardian" dated 1940-11-09.

An entry dated November 1940 lists Chesley as one of the Ardingly recruits (Ardingly is a village in the District of West Sussex, England) on board the SS Nerissa destined for Liverpool, England via Boston, St. John's and Halifax. He was 24 years old at the time.



SS Nerissa

A passenger and cargo steamer of 5,583 tons gross, the Nerissa was the final ship to be built for the old-established Red Cross Line service between New York, Halifax, and St. John's, Newfoundland. Her registered owners were the New York, Newfoundland Steamship Co. Ltd., the managers of which were C.T. Bowring & Co. Ltd., of Liverpool.

On 30 April 1941, she was torpedoed and sent to the bottom by German submarine U-552.

Back in Newfoundland following the war, Chesley and wife Vera (nee Butler) are found in the 1945 census living in Shearstown. They are both 26.

Chesley passed away in May 1957 of cardiac failure. He was only 46. He is buried in Trinty United Churchyard at Shearstown.

21 September 1940

Chesley Sparkes, of Shearstown, son of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Sparkes, left here on Tucsday to proceed overseas where he will serve on the Royal Air Force Ground Staff.

15 August 1942

Chesley H. Sparkes of the R.A.F. Ground Staff, is here this week from Canada and it visiting his father, Mr. Herbert Sparkes of Shearstown.

21 March 1942

Chesley Sparkes, son of Mr. Herbert Sparkes, Shearstown, who for the past year has been serving with the Royal Air Force Ground Staff in England, has been transferred to Canada. He arrived here last Saturday to spend a few days' leave before proceeding to his new post.

A reception in honor of Chesley Sparkes, R.A.F. Ground Staff, was held in the Orange hall, Shearstown, on Tuesday night.
