John and Myra Cave of Bay Roberts had three (3) children according to the 1945 Newfoundland general census. The enumeration listings of that census show John at age 48, Myra at 31 and children, Florence 10, Donald 8, George at 18 and working as a fisherman.

John left home at eighteen in 1955 and enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force. He was trained as a Radar technician and was posted in various places in Canada,

including New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba, and Nova Scotia.

It was in Nova Scotia; he met Jean Carol MacDonald and in 1958 they were married. They would have three children, Gail, John, and Carol Ann.

Donald served almost 20 years in the RCAF from enlistment in 1955 to retirement in 1974. Following his retirement from the military, he went to work for the Federal Government in the Department of Communications.

Finally settling in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, where he retired in 1992. Donald passed away in 2019. His complete obituary is below.

He was the loving father of Gail (Harold) Hillyer of St. Martin, MB; John (Patricia) Cave of Saskatoon; and Carol Ann (Glen) Baker of Grand Rapids, MB. He will also be dearly missed by his seven grandchildren, David, Nathan, Mellisa, Stephanie, Vanessa, Caitlin, and Logan; and twelve great-grandchildren. David will also be lovingly remembered by his sister, Florence of Bay Roberts, NFLD, many nephews and nieces, and many friends and acquaintances whose lives he touched. He was predeceased by his parents Myra and John Greenland Cave, and his brother George. In 1955, Max left Newfoundland and enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force. While in Nova Scotia, he married the

woman who was to be the love of his life, Jean MacDonald in 1958. Throughout his career as a Radar Technician, he served on many Radar stations along the Radar Pine Tree line, including stops in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario, and Manitoba. While in Manitoba, he was a member of the order of the Eastern Star, a member of the Masons, and responsible for Air Force Search and Rescue Team. He was also an ardent curler and hockey coach. Max retired from the Military in 1974 and joined the Federal Government Dept. of Communications working in Thompson, MB before his final transfer to Saskatoon. He retired for a second time in 1992. A lifelong *enthusiast of the outdoors, he enjoyed many* wonderful times while hunting, fishing, and camping. Max was a man of strong principles, and a man of many talents; from singing and painting, to electrical work and plumbing. A man able to achieve whatever goals or objectives he set for himself. He was also active in many churches as choir member, lay reader, usher, or member. For all his accomplishments and for all his adventures, his proudest was his family.
