George enlisted in the CEF (Canadian Expeditionary Force) at Vernon, British Columbia on November 2nd, 1915.

At that time, George is described as being twenty-three (23) years old, about 5' 6 ¾ " in height, weighing 139 lbs and having brown hair with grey eyes. He gave his trade as teacher, is single and a Methodist by faith. He has had six (6) months previous military experience with the 30th British Columbia

Horse Regiment. He is posted to the CAMC or Canadian Army Medical Corps.

1. 26 -03-1916: Arrived England on the S.S. Metagama




SS Metagama was a transatlantic ocean liner that was launched in 1914 and scrapped in 1934. The Canadian Pacific Railway Co owned her, and the Canadian Pacific Steamship Co operated her. She was a pioneering example of a "cabin class" passenger ship.

George and his war bride Marjorie Elizabeth Upson of Maidenhead, England, the lady he married in March 1918 settled in British Columbia.

The 1921 Canadian census shows the Dawes living in Coldstream, Yale, B.C. The couple now have twin girls (Marjorie & Barbara) and Arthur came along in 1922. By 1931, the family has grown to include two (2) more children.

George passed away in 1990 and Marjorie in 1997. They are buried in Vernon Cemetery at Vernon, North Okanagan District, British Columbia.
