Heber enlisted in the Royal Naval Reserve Newfoundland

Once discharged from service, Heber returned to his former life as a fisherman. The 1921 census shows Heber living in Blow me Down, Port de Grave. He is now 34 and married to Eliza (nee Batten) 20

years old and they have a son Norman who is 1 year old.

1935 sees the Dawe family has grown to include four (4) children, 2 boys and 2 girls. They are still residing in Port de Grave.

Ten years later, the 1945 Newfoundland census has Heber at 59, Eliza at 45 and they are still in Port de Grave but by now, there are only three (3) children at home with them. One daughter, Marjorie has moved out by this time.

Heber passed away in 1966 and Eliza in 1992. They are buried together in Port de Grave at St. Luke's Anglican Cemetery.
