

Henry Saunders Royal Naval Reserve (Newfoundland)

Born: 07 Oct 1889

Place of Birth: Shearstown, Newfoundland

**Parents:** James and Mary Jane (Mercer) Saunders

Henry enlisted in the Royal Naval Reserve (Newfoundland) in the summer of 1914. He gave his age as twenty-four (24) and his trade as carpenter upon enlisting.

Henry signed up for the duration of the war, which in his case meant he would serve for four (4) years and eight (8) months in total from Aug 1914 to April 1919.

The following entries are taken directly from his service record and reflect where he was posted throughout his time in the Navy:

- 12. 07 Apr 1919: Demobilized/discharged

Once out of the Naval Reserve, James is found in the 1921 Newfoundland general census living in Shearstown, Conception Bay, Newfoundland with his wife and two (2) children. Henry married a girl, Melina form Spaniard's Bay and they have 2 boys James and Nathaniel

1935 finds the Saunders family still in Shearstown. Henry is now 40 and Melina 38. They have 2 boys at home, Nathaniel (21) and John (8).

The 1945 census entries still have Henry and Melina in Shearstown with just John at home with them.

Henry died on the 17<sup>th</sup> of April 1967 and is buried at Shearstown in the Gospel Preachers Cemetery.
