



MALCOM LITTLEJOHN

Malcolm Littlejohn was born in Bay Roberts to parents George and Ethel Littlejohn on July 6th, 1920.

The 1921 census shows Malcolm at age one with only one sibling, an older sister, Winnie, at 4.

Malcolm enlisted in the Royal (Newfoundland) Artillery, subsequently transferred to the Royal Artillery and given the service No. 970820. Based on the service number, Malcolm was not a member of *The First Four Hundred to enlist in the Royal Artillery on April 14, 1940*. His number is a little too high to have been part of this contingent

The Royal Artillery (Newfoundland nominal roll) shows a “Maxwell Guy Littlejohn” as the only M. Littlejohn on the roll and the service number matches. It is presumed that Malcolm and Maxwell are the same person, despite the different spelling, an error that would have been quite easy to make in writing down the name.

From the picture, it appears that young Malcolm had an affinity for motorcycles. He’s pictured here riding one somewhere in France??

Malcolm did return home following the war and eventually moved to Ontario, presumably for work.

He passed away on September 6th, 1987 in the Scarborough area. Unfortunately, his gravesite has not at yet been identified.
