Olive, born in 1936 was the fifth child of seven born to James and Winnie Snow of Bay Roberts.

The 1945 Newfoundland general census lists the Snow family as residing in Bay Roberts. Father, James is 52, mother "Winnie" is 47 and the children are Ernest 21, James 17, John 16, Annie 12, Olive 9, Cynthia 5 and Calvin 1.

Olive's dad, Captain James S, Snow was Captain of the Northern Ranger at the time, while brother Ernest was a stewart on the vessel.

The newspaper clipping from the Evening Telegram dated 06 December 1956, notes that Olvie is serving at Clinton Air Base at Clinton, Ontario.



From the clipping, it is known that she was serving in the mid 50"s

An exerpt from Wikipedia provides the following information about the Air Base:

"Canadian Forces Base Clinton, CFB Clinton for short, was a Canadian Forces Base located near Clinton, Ontario. It initially opened in July 1941 as RAF Station Clinton under the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan as a training unit for radar operators during a

period when radar was a top secret device. UK, Canadian, US and other servicemen were trained at Clinton, with practical flights being carried out at nearby RCAF Station Centralia. Clinton remained the primary radar training site for Canadian Forces personnel through the Cold War era, with continued expansions throughout the 1950s and 60s. As part of a centralization effort, CFB Clinton was closed in 1971, with the site abandoned by 1972. A number of buildings remain on the site, including a large "golf ball" radome."
