Roy was born on 11 April 1921 to parents John and Pearl (Brown) Yetman of Bay Roberts, Newfoundland.

He enlisted in Newfoundland Overseas Forestry Unit (NOFU) on 12 March 1941 and was assigned Service #2110. Shortly thereafter, he enlisted in Royal Air Force (RAF) and was assigned the British Service #1344330. He served with the RAF until being demobilized on 20 June 1946. He saw action in England & India.

Following his service, he returned to Bay Roberts and married Annie Seward on July 29, 1946. They would eventually make their home in St. John's and together their family would consist of 3 girls and a boy, and later became proud grandfather & great grandfather.

He worked in Greenland as a civilian in 1949-50 at the Headquarters, Greenland Bass Command for the Military Air Transport service, USAF.

Roy returned home to Newfoundland, settled in St. John's and spent the majority of his working career at Heap & Partners in St. John's, the company from which he retired.

He passed away on 15 August 2007 at the age of 86 and is buried at the Salvation Army Cemetery, Blackmarsh Road, St. John's.
