



By 1945, Wallace is back home in Bay Roberts, married to Emily (from Trinity South) and they have a son David who is one.

The Snows moved from Bay Roberts to Ontario, settling in Barrie.

Wallace Lesley Snow was born to parents James and Winnie Snow in 1922, the second child in a family of six at the time Wallace was the second son born to the couple.

Raised in Bay Roberts with a seafaring father, Wallace was no stranger to the sea. Following in his older brother's footsteps (Allen), he enlisted in the Newfoundland Navy as seaman and transferred to the Royal Navy within short order.

He was assigned Service No. 230100 and was a member of the 14th Naval Contingent from Newfoundland to report for duty in England. The 14th Contingent left Newfoundland in late 1940 or early 1941.

By the end of the war, Wallace was one of four members of the Snow family to volunteer and see service. Along with his father, James and two brothers, Allen and Ernest, it is certainly an understatement that he was part of a family dedicated to service.
