Wilfred's parents married on 20 May 1918. Nathan, Wilfred's father, was serving with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment at the time. He met and married Agnes Taylor of Ayrshire, Scotland. A year later in April 1919, Wilfred was born. Records show clearly that the family moved to Newfoundland later that same year, 1919, so although Wilfred is claimed as a native-born

son of Newfoundland, he was actually born in Scotland.

According to the Newfoundland general census, Nathan, Agnes, Wilfred and now Donald (Newfoundland born) are listed as living in Frenches Cove, Bay Roberts.

By 1935, they are living in St. John's on Pleasant Street. By this time, the family has grown to include five children: Wilfred 16, Edward Donald 14, Leslie 12, Harold 8, and Yvonne 4.

1938 brought the death of Nathan, leaving Agnes a single mother with five children.

With the onset of World War II, Wilfred enlisted in the 166<sup>th</sup> Royal Artillery Regiment Newfoundland. The first 400, of which Wilfred was one, embarked for Great Britian on April 14<sup>th</sup>, 1940. According to his enlistment, Wilfred was given the nickname of P.U. by his fellow artillery buddies.

By 1945 and the end of hostilities, Wilfred is back in Newfoundland and is found in the 1945 census enumeration at age 26, married to Mary Ellen (nee Roche) of St. John's and living on Brazil Street, St. John's.

Together the couple had five children. Son Allan was born in 1948 and died at age 26 in January 1973. He is buried in Gander.

Wilfred passed away in 2000 and is buried in Gander, Newfoundland. His complete obituary is noted below. Mary died in 2007 and is also buried at Gander.

Wilf was a veteran of the 166th Newfoundland Regiment-Mentioned in Dispatches, a Provincial Past President to the Royal Canadian Legion, member of the Executive of Dominion Command. and five times President of the Legion Branch #8, Gander. He was also involved in many local public service organizations, serving on the Board of Directors of the Canadian Corps of Commissioners and the Legion Manor in Gander. He was a founder of the Gander Rod and Gun Club and 537th Air Cadet Squadron. Resting at Stacey's Funeral Home, Gander, Visitation Tuesday and Wednesday from 2-9 P.M. Funeral Service on Thursday, November 23rd, 2000, at 10 A.M. at St. Martin's Anglican Cathedral, with interment at the Commonwealth Wars Graves Cemetery,
