According to the 1921 Newfoundland general census, William was born to Lizzie (25) and John Edwin (25). At the time they were living with John's parents, William, and Elizabeth at Bareneed, Newfoundland. William named after his grandfather is just a few months old at the time the census was taken.

1935 finds John Edwin a widower at age 39, his wife, Lizzie having passed in 1933. He is working as a teacher and as a single parent has four (4) children to raise. William (Cecil) 14, Edwin 13, Shirley11 and Daisy 7.

William enlisted in the Royal Naval Reserve of Newfoundland in early 1940, as he was one of the 177 men of the 4<sup>th</sup> Naval Contingent that embarked St. John's on board the HMS Nova Scotia, March 1<sup>st</sup>, 1940, destined for Liverpool, England

1945 finds William giving his residence as the Merchant Navy Hospital, St. John's West. The actual 1945 Newfoundland census shows two of William's sisters, Shirley 21 and Daisy 17 are living with their grandmother Elizabeth 75, in Bareneed. There is no mention of his father, John, although he did not pass away until 1957.

William who never married passed away in 1972 and is buried in St. Mark's Anglican Cemetery at Bareneed, Newfoundland.
