

William James Earle Royal Naval Reserve (Newfoundland) Royal Navy Service No. C/195268 World War II

William's place of birth is given as Bay Roberts like his older brother, Roy and older sister, Lilly but the 1921 Newfoundland general census finds the family living in Jackson's Arm, St. Barbe area, Newfoundland. The family is entered in the census listing with the name "Earl" not Earle as it should have been. Parents, Wm. Robert

is 32 and wife Maude 30, respectively. Roberts is working a s a carpenter in the area. The connection to the St. Barbe area seems to be from Maude who was born in Tilt Cove.


"Tilt Cove is a town located southeast of Baie Verte on Notre Dame Bay and was founded in 1813. The official population was 5 in the 2021 census."

At the 1935 census, the family has now moved to the Bay Roberts area and are living in Shearstown. William is 15. Living at home with parents, are sons Roy 21, William 15, and Robert 14.

William enlisted in the Royal Naval Reserve of Newfoundland and by default the Royal Navy of Great Britain sometime in early 1940, since he is listed as part of the 6<sup>th</sup> naval contingent to ship overseas. The 6<sup>th</sup> contingent departed St. John's on April 26<sup>th</sup>, 1940.

William's service number C/195268 tells, by the "C", that his home port division for his time in service was Chatham, England.

In January 1944,a ship, the Fort Amherst, departed St. John's destined for the UK and was transporting British Naval Personnel. According to the ships' log, William was passenger #5 on the list and is described as being 5'9", with black hair and blue eyes.
