



William Richard Lyons
World War I

William was born on December 20th, 1895. He was the grandson of Mary Jane (Abram) French of Country Road, Bay Roberts.

William enlists in the Royal Naval Reserve for one year on the 22nd of March 1915. He was 20 years old at his time on enlistment, single, able to write (signed his enlistment paper) and in the space for parents' names, he writes his grandmother, Mary Jane French and his place of birth as Bay Roberts.

From research we find out that William probably lied about his age and was born in 1898, not 1895 as on his enlistment documents.

Since William signed up for a one-year period. His service record reflects that and shows only three entries as follows:

1, HMS Calypso 22 March 1915 – 30 December 1915.

2. HMS Briton: 30 December 1915 – 22 March 1916.

3. Completed engagement and discharged 22 March 1916.

Following his discharge in March of 1916, William seems to disappear from all official documents researched.

It seems that William left Newfoundland and returned to his home in Maine. He married Nina Florence (nee White) and together they had 3 sons, Stanley, Joseph and James.
